## **WORLD AIDS DAY 2002**

Last year, the planning for World AIDS Day (WAD) was challenging to say the least. While we continue to deal with diminished funding for HIV/AIDS and coping with New York still having the highest HIV infection rate in the nation, we had to deal with an unplanned disaster of September 11th. In spite of these obstacles, New Yorkers found space in their lives and hearts for both, and we were able to educate our viewers about loss, compassion, and HIV/AIDS.

This year we will have, at press, over two dozen schools participating. Some of these schools use the Quilt more than once a year, and creating panels. And we are always delighted to invite new schools who have heard of the Quilt and our work and want to get involved. And with the success of our Golf Outing in Long Island this past summer, we will be able to provide grants to K-12 schools, and numerous displays at branches of the Brooklyn Public Library.

One of this year's return participants is American Express at the World Trade Center. With the Winter Garden recently reopening and employees returning to work, most of us cannot imagine what it must be like to returning to work downtown. We honor American Express in their continued efforts to remember those we have lost to AIDS in the post year of 9/11. Ten sections of Quilt will be on display for employees, clients, and visitors to view.

The Quilt will also be on display at St. John the Divine Cathedral from November 27 through December 5th. Thanks to a grant from Broadway Cares/Equity Fights AIDS and the conviction of one volunteer Jimmy Roe, this high-profile display will allow us to share the Quilt with thousands of visitors each day. Jimmy's hope is that displaying the Quilt will help St. John with their healing process after the loss of their beautiful tapestries from the recent fire.

# Chapter Accomplishments

### **GOLF OUTING SUCCESS**

In early August 2002, our second annual Long Island Golf Outing/Fundraiser. It took place at the Wind Watch Golf and Country Club. The benefit raised \$9,000 which will continue to underwrite our School Quilt Program in Long Island and the boroughs of New York City. With "tee" sponsors not as plentiful as last year because of their generosity to disaster relief funds, the outing was still successful in raising funds needed to keep the work of our Chapter going.

The event's luncheon was once again an amazing experience. Ten sections of the Quilt on display for golfers and outsiders to view. The raffle prizes also exceeded last year's efforts, containing donated items like hotel getaways, oil paintings, golf packages, restaurant and store certificates and many beautiful baskets-of-cheer.

For men and women golfers, top prizes included golf-for-4 at the Wind Watch, DVD players, and hotel getaways. Moreover, each par-3 had hole-in-one prizes, such as a 2002 Toyota car, American Airline tickets, Callaway golf clubs and a camcorder. Golfers were also challenged to out-drive the Outing Coordinator to win free 50/50-raffle tickets, and pictures were taken and distributed to foursomes following the outing.

Next year's event is already being planned, and your help is needed. We are welcoming any boys and/or girls summer camps in the Long Island and the surrounding area that would be interested in coming to view the Quilt display during next year's outing. As Suffolk and Nassau Counties continue to reach high HIV infection rates - the highest in New York State - we must continue to find ways to educate our youth so they can grow up and live in a world without AIDS.

Our heartfelt thanks goes to Liz Ebert and her family, who gave their time and talents to this successful event.

### STREET FAIR SUCCESS

The Chapter held our 10th annual NYC Unfolds Street Fair. With the assistance of Mardi Gras Productions, our festival producers, and Henry Kaufman Management Center at Stern Business School, who provided space at NYU, ten sections of the Quilt were viewable to the public. Also on board were the local AIDS agencies, GMHC, AIDS Service Center Lower Manhattan, Jewish Board of Family and Children Services, and Positive Health Project, who shared their programs available to New Yorkers.

We also had the pleasure of meeting a group of women from Staten Island who for the past year haven't been able to see the panel they made for Anita Neuburof, their friend and colleagues who died from AIDS in 1997. Borough delegate Pamela Abrams had been working with these women to bring their panel to New York City. Many e-mails and phone calls had taken place, but no one had ever meet. Then suddenly, the sounds of joyous voices calling "it's here" were heard, and it was clear that these joyous expressions were from this determined group of women.

It is always the Chapter's goal to try to serve our panelmakers, including those we have never met. Sometimes we are not as successful as others, but the joining of spirits and love that took place at our Street Fair this year reminded us why were are here and what our purpose is.

### NEW PANELS RECEIVED

This summer, we had the pleasure of receiving a number of new panels, mostly from school projects. Five of them came from E.W. Miles Middle School in Long Island. Teacher Bernadette Kraljic teaches HIV/AIDS to her students each year. Annual dedications had stopped for awhile but this year she was able to continue. A number of panels had been made in the interim, so they have panels to dedicate and turn in the Chapter.

One panel out of all of the sticks out in particular. Many have Ryan White's name of them as they have learned about his life and work from their teacher. One panel included not only Ryan's name, but besides his name was the name of Nkosa Johnson, the young boy from South Africa who dies this past year.

Many adults know about both of these brave young boys who who challenged their governments, and dealt with school and neighborhoods who feared them. But to find out that young students in a small city in Long Island have learning about these two global heroes, and felt compelled to make a panel to remember both of them only reconfirmed that the Quilt continues to be an incredible way to teach kids about HIV/AIDS, and globally.

The Chapter commends the dedication and commitment of this teacher in the fight against AIDS. We will continue to attend local conferences and outreaches to invite other schools and teachers to use the Quilt and the unique power to educate the smallest of learners.
